



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING between THE ARCHITECTS' COUNCIL OF EUROPE and BRAZILIAN COUNCIL OF ARCHITECTURE AND URBANISM

The **Architects Council of Europe** (ACE) is a non-profit organisation that represents the architectural profession at European level. Its membership consists of regulatory and professional representative bodies throughout Europe. Through them, the ACE represents the interests of architects.

The Conselho de Arquitetura e Urbanismo do Brasil (CAU/BR - Council of Architecture and Urbanism in Brazil) was created in 2010 to regulate the practice of Architecture and Urbanism in the country. CAU/BR's purpose is "to orient, discipline and supervise the practice of the profession of architecture and urbanism, to ensure the faithful observance of the principles of ethics and discipline throughout the country, and to strive to improve the practice of architecture and urbanism".

- WHEREAS the **Architects Council of Europe**, henceforth called **ACE**, and the **Brazilian Council of Architecture and Urbanism**, henceforth called **CAU/BR**, are mindful of the importance of the roles of the respective organisations and convinced of the need and desire to reinforce the cooperation between them;
- WHEREAS **ACE** is the Organisation that represents the architectural profession in Europe;
- WHEREAS **CAU/BR** is the Organisation that orients, disciplines and supervises the practice of the profession of architecture and urbanism in Brazil;
- WHEREAS **ACE** and **CAU/BR** recognise the importance of working towards a more consistent and efficient rationalisation of resources:
- WHEREAS both Organisations enjoy their own statutes, bylaws, procedures and also their full independence;
- WHEREAS both Organisations are dealing with similar issues from different perspectives and with different legal frameworks;

- NOW THEREFORE, recognising their shared goals and convinced that the reinforced cooperation described in this Memorandum of Understanding will help to consolidate actions and efforts towards addressing mutual concerns and interests pertaining to architecture, architectural education, research, professional standards and regulation, professional mobility, environmental issues, professional development and practice, political influence, among others;
- LIKEWISE, confident that this cooperation will also help to promote harmonious coordination between the ACE and the CAU/BR, in relation to their respective decisions and actions and,
- FURTHERMORE, with full knowledge of the various work areas in which such a rationalisation can be sought, and being aware of the mutual benefit that can result for each of the two Organisations in adopting an approach that allows for better working synergies;

THE TWO ORGANISATIONS NOW AGREE THE FOLLOWING

- 1. To rationalise the resources of both Organisations in pertinent activities at all levels;
- 2. To reinforce the capacity for action of the both Organisations towards third parties, exploring opportunities for joint actions;
- 3. To invite and encourage reciprocal representation at their respective working bodies and to share information of mutual interest:
- 4. To promote high quality professional standards and code of ethics;
- 5. To exchange information regarding architectural practice and procedures for design and construction
- 6. To affirm and promote the basic principles of professionalism contained in the "Accord on Recommended International Standards of Professionalism in Architectural Practice," adopted by the International Union of Architects (UIA);
- 7. To affirm and promote consistent professional qualifications criteria and national syllabus based on international standards, such as the UNESCO/UIA Charter for Architectural Education;
- 8. To encourage an international exchange of knowledge through publications, seminars, exhibitions, lectures and exchange programs;





- 9. To develop effective political action to influence opinion makers and policy builders to create better legislation and conditions for quality architecture to flourish;
- 10. And finally, to undertake to establish and concretely define a closer cooperation between the parties at political, technical and working levels, both organisations commit themselves to study an agreement that will facilitate their respective members to practice in Europe and Brazil.

GENERAL PROVISIONS

- This Memorandum shall not be legally binding on either Party.
- Each Party may refer publicly to the existence of this Memorandum of Understanding but may not claim, indicate of suggest that the relationship between the Parties is other than as set out in this Memorandum of Understanding. Formal contracts entered into pursuant to this Memorandum of Understanding will contain express provisions dealing with publicity relating to those contracts.
